Sacraments= rites and rituals that the believers receives a special gift of grace, 'outward sign of inward grace'



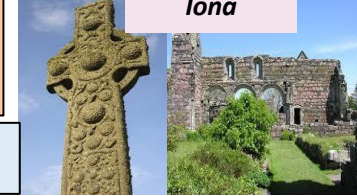

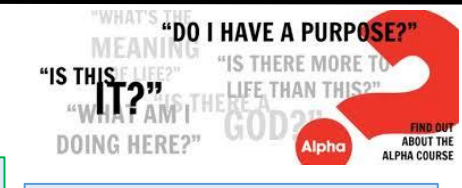
Iona

Charity= an organisation set up to provide help and raise money for those in need.

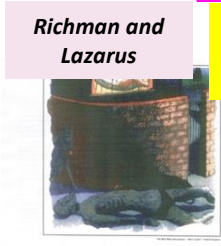


Charity- giving to those in need

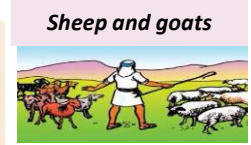


Reconciliation statue- Coventry Cathedral
